
What to Pack

There are some things you cannot bring to Canada or will need to declare when you arrive, such as cash over CAD \$10,000 and food or animal products. Refer to the [Canada Border Services Agency's guidelines](#) for travelling to Canada.

This list is recommended items for you to bring (and not to bring) as you prepare for your arrival to residence.

What we provide:

- bed with bedding (flat sheet, fitted sheet, pillow cases)
- comforter
- pillow
- desk and chair
- storage space for clothing
- Locker and Lock (to store important documents and personal items)
- Laundry basket
- Toilet tissue
- Iron and ironing board available to borrow
- Laundry detergent
- Basic first aid supplies (bandaids, over the counter medicine)
- Trash bags
- Board games, sports equipment, gaming consoles to borrow
- Meals and late snacks

Recommended items to bring:

Items for Your Uniforms

- Standard black dress shoes
- Black belt (no large buckle)
- Black dress socks

Winter Gears

Students arriving in the warmer months (August and October semesters) may choose to buy these item in Canada instead

- Wind breaker or sweater
- Winter outerwear – Coat, mitts, gloves, toque, scarf, winter boots (waterproof or water resistant)

Casual wear in residence room

- Casual clothes
- Pajamas for sleeping

Shower

- Shower Sandals (like plastic or rubber flip flops)
- Bathrobe
- Toiletry bag / pouch

Sports

- Swimming wear
- Athletic wear (depending on individual sports interests)
- Indoor non-marking sneakers/athletic shoes (for gym use)

Dress for Special Events

- Events such as the Semi Formal for which students may wish to bring 'nice' clothes (dress, jacket, dress pants)
- Traditional clothing that represent the culture of your country/region

(Regional Dinners, International Fashion Show, etc)

Toiletries

- Toiletries (soap, face wash, deodorant, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, lotion)
- Toothbrush, toothpaste, mouth wash, dental floss
- Razors and shaving products
- Nail clippers and nail files
- Feminine hygiene products
- Make up and make up remover
- Kleenex (facial tissue)
- Brush and comb
- Hairdryer (1200 Watt or lower)
- Multiple sets of towels (bath towels, hand towels, face cloths)

The school organizes shopping trips on the weekend for students to make purchases at Wal-mart before school starts in August and January Semesters

Electronic Items

- Chargers for all the electronics you bring – cell phone, laptop, etc.
- International Adaptor if your plug is not the North America parallel flat pin type

Hygiene and Safety Products

- Disposable or cloth face masks
- Hand sanitizer
- Face shield

Optional items to buy in Canada

Due to warranty issue and limited space in luggage, it may be easier to purchase the following items in Canada

- Hot water kettle with an overheat safety switch or automatic shut off
- Hair Dryer (1200 Watt or lower)

Items not permitted in residence:

- Televisions, monitors, gaming systems
- Halogen lamps can become very hot. Halogen desk lamps should be avoided.
- Desk LED Lamps are permitted. However, decorative flashing LED string light is not permitted.
- Wifi routers - personal router will cause network slow down or failure
- Furniture
- Knives
- Tobacco products for students under the age of 19 (Ontario Law)

The common room in every residence has a microwave for student use.

- Cooking equipment and appliances (kettles without auto shut-off, toasters, hot pots, immersion heaters and microwaves).
- Open flames are not permitted in any room due to fire code/safety regulations - candles / incense are not allowed

Items found will be removed from the room and kept by the residence. Items will be returned to the student when checking out.
