Flying to Canada Checklist

As an international student, to be able to enter Canada, you are required to follow these requirements as specified by <u>Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA)</u>.

Documents to Bring

Before you travel to Canada, you'll need to make sure you have the right documents to enter the country. (*Ref:*Travel, quarantine and borders)

Before Arrival into Canada:

1. All arriving students should login into ezReport card and:

Complete and submit Arrival to CIC Residence Form



Request airport transportation service if required. Available on Arrival to CIC Residence Form.

- 2. Have the following travel documents (do NOT place any of these documents in your checked luggage):
 - a. Passport
 - b. CIC Letter of Acceptance
 - c. IRCC letter (Study Permit Approval Document)
 - i. Print and present Study Permit Approval letter to the border officer when you enter Canada. The border officer will then issue your study permit (a piece of paper).
 - ii. Make sure that your medical exam has not expired: Your medical exam results are good for 12 months only. If you don't come to Canada as a visitor, student or worker within that time, you may need to do another exam.
- 3. Visa or eTA (if applicable)

Depending on your country of citizenship, you will need a valid <u>Temporary Resident Visa (TRV)</u> or <u>Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA)</u> — US citizens are exempt.

Welcome to Canada! When you first enter Canada, the border officer will give you your study permit.

Transportation

CIC Arranged Pickup

CIC arranged pickup service can be ordered through Arrival Form on your ezReport or by emailing airport.pickup@cic-totalcare.com.

To ensure there are no problems with meeting your driver please follow the instructions in your Airport Pickup documentation. You can contact Airport Pickup at: airport.pickup@cic-totalcare.com or +1-289-684-2060 to let them know you have arrived.

Your driver will take you directly to CIC's Residence. No stops will be permitted unless it is for an emergency health reason.

Self-Arranged Pickup

If you/your parents will be arranging your own pickup, you will have to **inform your liaison officer** of:

- The date you arrive
- Who will be picking you up
- The date you will check in to residence
